Title: Roles of Humanitarian agencies in conflict zones around the world.

A humanitarian agency also known as an aid agency, is an organisation dedicated to distributing aid where many professional aid agents exist both within government or between government as multilateral donors and as private voluntary organisations or non-governmental organisations. They are usually involved in: searching for, collecting and transporting the wounded and sick, missing and dead; providing medical treatment to the wounded and sick; assisting prisoners of war; and assisting the civilian population through the provision of humanitarian relief.

There has been an increasing recognition of the relationship of both humanitarian aid and development aid with conflict and conflict transformation. This is partly (1) due to the growing number of humanitarian catastrophes in the last 10 years, creating an enormous challenge for both humanitarian aid and development aid. Most of these catastrophes were human-made, caused by civil wars or protracted (2), stale-mate conflicts. As a result, many resources that formerly went to longer-term development aid must now be diverted to first aid measures; and, in consequence, efforts of longer-term development projects have been destroyed.

The humanitarian agencies have many different roles to play. They are here to help people who have been a victim of natural disasters, wars, famines, homeless and refugees. The primary objective of humanitarian agencies is save lives, alleviate suffering and maintain human dignity. NGOs provide cash and essential relief to meet urgent basic needs including food, shelter and hygiene items. Wherever possible we enable the people we support to decide for themselves what they need by providing assistance in the form of cash transfers.

There are a lot of humanitarian organisations and volunteers but **they are still needed**. First of all, they are important, because some people in need can't fight for their own rights, so they need other people's voices to help them to solve the situation. Since the start of cold war, the humanitarian agencies had a role to play in supporting the transition process emerged in the international community for a cost-effective and non-military ways to contain the growing number of internal conflict. Even during World War, I, World War II, the conflict between Israel versus Palestine, Taliban versus Afghanistan and Russia versus Ukraine.

The humanitarian agencies had served a major role. They responded to humanitarian crisis in Ukraine by providing essentials for displaced people through collaboration. The humanitarian agencies are working with partners in Poland and Ukraine to reach vulnerable communities and families with essential health and financial services as well as culturally completed humanitarian assistance and keeping the undemocratic behaviour in check.

Above all else, humanitarian agencies will benefits the NATO if they engaged in a war against Russia in need of multifaceted ways. Hence their funding allows to provide live saving supplies like medicine, foods, water and health care. They provide the emergency, short-term assistance necessary to keep people alive and healthy during or following a crisis.

Humanitarian aid is important because it provides life-saving assistance to people affected by conflicts, disasters and poverty. Humanitarian aid is vital in reducing the impact of crises on communities, helping recovery and improving preparedness for future emergencies.
